### **Directions to the Colorado Natural Heritage Program (CNHP)**

CNHP is located on campus at Colorado State University, on the second floor of the General Services Building, at the intersection of South Mason Street and A Street, just west, and over the railroad tracks from the CSU running track at Pitkin Street and College Avenue.

- From **I25**, take the **Prospect Road** exit, and head west, toward the foothills
- Follow **Prospect** west to **College Avenue**
- Turn **right/north** on **College**
- Turn **left/west** at first light at **Pitkin Street**
- Turn **right/north** just over railroad tracks onto **Mason Street**

- The **General Service Building (GSB)** is the second building on the left, a tan brick, three-story building , on the corner of Mason Street and A Street
- Enter the GSB on the north side, and take the stairs next to the drinking fountain to the second floor
- Turn left at the top of the stairs and the **CNHP conference room 242** is the first door on the right. Offices for CNHP staff continue down the hallway.

#### Parking

On request, CNHP can usually provide single day visitor passes for parking areas marked A or Z. There are A and Z parking spots on the west, north, and east sides of the General Services building; on the east side of the railroad tracks; and also just south of Pitkin Street and east of the railroad tracks (head here if all other parking areas are full).

There are metered parking spots south of the GSB and east of the railroad tracks. There is additional metered parking in first level of the parking garage on Pitkin Street to the north of GSB.

There are two-hour and unrestricted parking areas in the neighborhoods east of College Ave.

Visitors with Colorado State Vehicle License Plates can park without a permit in any lot marked A or Z.
