

Pyrolaceae (Wintergreen Family)

(*Ericaceae*)


Look Alikes: The only *Pyrola* with white or gray-mottled leaf veins.

Flowering/Fruiting Period: June-early August/July-August.

Distribution: British Columbia to South Dakota, south to California, Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado (Boulder, Conejos, Douglas, El Paso, Garfield, Jackson, La Plata, Mineral, Ouray and Routt Cos.).

Habitat: Cool, moist slopes and ravines, in lodgepole pine, Douglas-fir, and ponderosa pine forests. Elev. 6000-9800 ft.
